## ANNOUNCEMENTS FOR JANUARY 18, 2026

**December Statistics:** We distributed 150 Holiday Boxes full of food and frozen meat plus bread and produce. These boxes were purchased with grants from the Bay Area Community Foundation and their Men's Philanthropy Group. In total we served 445 people from 161 families with 10,341 pounds of food. The "snow day" on December 10 kept our numbers a little lower than we would have expected. But we still grew! Last December we served 421 people from 136 families with 6,673 pounds of food (with 90 Holiday Boxes distributed).

**2025 Statistics:** What a year! In total we served 7,248 people from 2,494 visits with 78,721 pounds of food. People came from nine Bay County cities, with the vast majority from Bay City zip codes. Again, our 2025 numbers would have been higher without the snow day. What a blessing it is to serve our community!

Now we are off in 2026! We already have exciting things to share:

- All of the new shelving is now installed in the pantry, thanks to a great group of volunteers who worked 5 hours to make it happen. The old shelving went into our storeroom across the hall, along with our new freezer. The shelving and freezer were purchased with the grant from the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan (along with the shopping carts).

- We received tons of food donations from individuals and food drives in December, so our storeroom is full.
- Monetary donations have been received which put our bank account in a good position. It helps to have all the extra food so we don't need to place any orders right now.
- At the end of December, we received another grant from Bay Area Community Foundation to start and maintain a gluten-free section in the pantry in 2026. We are researching and hope to have that in place by the end of January.
- The Ornament Project was well received. We are still collecting the donations from area businesses, so we don't have a total yet.
- We are waiting to hear from Meijer about the Simply Give donations. Stay tuned!


